This week, members of the House of Lords have written to Parish Priests asking for parishioners' help in upholding the dignity of human life. Lord David Alton writes: "*We share a longstanding interest in human rights and protecting the right to life for all people, including disabled and older people. We are asking for your help to stop yet another attempt to introduce assisted suicide legislation.*" Postcards are at the back of church, which you can fill in and send to your MP in advance of the proposed Bill's Second Reading on Friday 11th of September.
